



hhh, Autumn! It may not feel like it yet, but soon enough it will be cooler, school will be in full swing and football, soccer, field hockey, band, cheerleading, fall ball, scouts, brownies, you name it... time will be at a premium. As you look ahead, please pencil in November 7th, 8 a.m. - noon, for the Pumpkin Patch and Fall clean-up effort. Other Property and Facilities (P&F) items of interest- the 2015 P&F plan was to contract to re-seal & re-stripe the parking lot for a modest fee. Upon closer review, it was determined that an actual re-paving and repair was required to gair more useful durability of the parking lot.

Unfortunately paving contractor bids for that work well-exceed the 2015 planned budget and it will be shelved until a further review in the 2016 budget year. In the interim, P&F will continue with parking lot spot repairs as needed. P&F is pursuing bids to repair bad windows (blown seals), replace deteriorating trim and replace the tall Sanctuary

windows (due to blown seals). Glass contractor bids are pending but it is intended to complete this work in 2015 with 2015 funds as planned. Also, we had another emergent repair for the HVAC in the Fellowship wing just prior to Vacation Bible School (a failed blower motor) and a Fire Alarm Panel switch failure. We also had some ant and mice "visitors" in the kitchen which we addressed with our contracted pest control service. A reminder that if you use the kitchen, please be sure to clean it up after! And finally, Jim Birch, over the course of several days, taped off and painted the inside of the Sanctuary (except the ceiling, way too high!).



Finally, due to energy saving measures (programmable thermostats and "green" lighting systems) we have managed to keep our power and gas bills at or below previous levels. To further improve on this, we intend to weather-strip some of the doors again.

- -Jerry Deaton for installing VBS and Lawn movie fencing
- -Roger Crone for his custodial support, which covers many areas, too numerous to capture here.

Property and Facilities (P&F) committee chairs are Nate Nickerson and Roger Crone. Our group is involved in keeping our church, property and landscape in top shape to best reflect God's blessings to all who pass-by or visit.

Please feel free to pass along to Roger or Nate any concerns or observations you may have regarding our church's facilities or if you are interested in volunteering to get involved in P&F. Through the efforts of folks like

Roger Crone, Jerry Deaton, Jim Birch, Tom Briggs and Kirk Reno we are able to bring experienced insight into addressing emergent facilities repairs.




Discipleship Group for Parents

- c. trusting God to see them through all the storms that may come into their lives?


