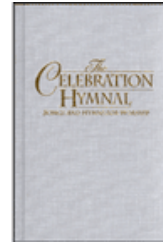


Special Music for the Summer

Adult Sunday School Classes May 16 - June 13

Remembering the Forgotten God – The source of life, power, and understanding: Holy Spirit

To a frightening extent, the church has forgotten about the Holy Spirit. In truth, the only thing that is really different between a follower of Jesus and others is the active, enlivening presence of the Spirit in the individual's life made possible by what Jesus accomplished. The apostle Paul describes this intimate relationship as a foretaste of heaven.

So, how is your taste lately? Have you forgotten the God with the still small voice and amazing generosity for those who align themselves with his way? News from the 5 Smooth Stones:

Siesta for One Facilitator --

Fiesta for Another Who Follows a Dream

For the past 12 weeks, the *5 Smooth Stones* have enjoyed great discussions on Tuesday nights, using one of the Max Lucado's Life Lessons series – the Gospel of Mark. They've had a great run for three years, beginning with six, doubling in size the following year and then giving birth to the Stepping Stones last year. Now the *5 Stones* (literally five of them) have reached a time when it's proper to terminate and reflect on the successes of their time together: the peace felt when doing ministry together, awesome revelations, experiencing sister/brotherhood, kindness, forgiveness and miracles of healing and spiritual growth. They'll celebrate their last evening Mexican style on Cuatro de Mayo (May 4th), complete with a piñata and someone named Margarita. *Only on special occasions do they invite her.* Tracy Louk, one of the original Stones, loves Mexico, and they all love Mexican cuisine, but there's something else that makes them want to shout "Cha Cha Cha!"

Many things have fallen into place and the timing is

right for Tracy to step out and co-facilitate a **Young Single Adult Discipleship Group** this fall. Pray that God will use this new discipleship group next fall to be a stepping stone to a larger purpose – a Young Adult Ministry at KirkWood and bring many young people to Christ – and to our family at KirkWood.

Also, Gina has decided to take a siesta from discipleship group facilitating next year and rest in the comfort of another group. New facilitators are being trained for leadership, to be announced in the fall. As discipleship group members respond to a calling to be a facilitator, they'll be trained and God will give them what they need to keep the Discipleship Group Ministry going.

Facilitators, let your group know when you are ready to take a siesta from facilitating. Some of you may be able to go on for years, but if you're thinking of passing on leadership, prepare your group early and mentor a co-facilitator. Recruit those who have a strong passion for discipleship groups and are devoted to the calling. It doesn't require being perfect, just passionate about Christ and following Him.

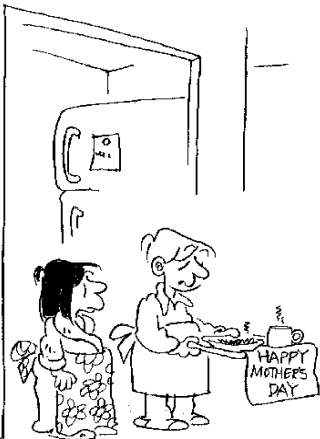

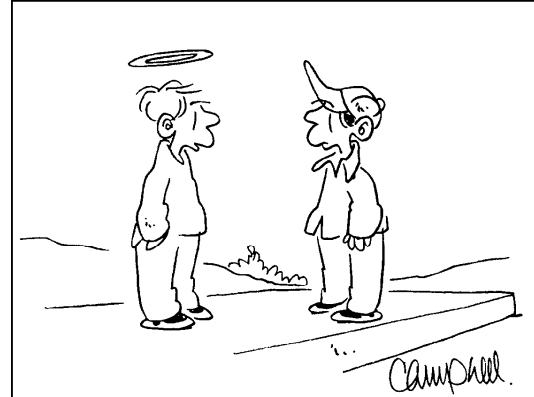
